

Ruth Goodman weaves a tale of kings, queens, peasants, artisans, and other peoples from the late fifteenth, sixteenth and early seventeenth centuries. The book illustrates how people's views on sex, religion, childbirth, education, marriage and other things varied and they often had tondo wit their social background as well as who was king at the time. Issues such as work, immigration, cleanliness are also addressed, including dispelling common held beliefs about these people. This is a must have for every history enthusiast and aspiring historian.
