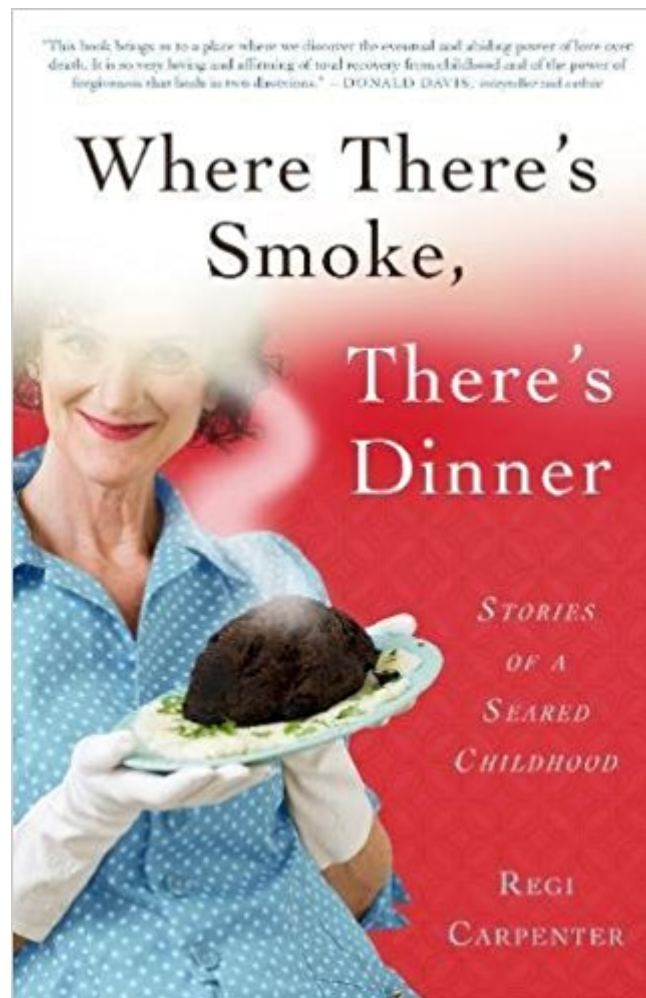

Regi Carpenter, was born in our town, and has been Depauville Free Library's resident storyteller for our children's summer reading program for four years. Lucky us. It would be an understatement to say that she held the children's undivided attention, although, usually, that would be high praise. But the children who eagerly returned each Tuesday morning to hear Regi tell tales were expecting more. They were excited at the prospect of being carried off again and again to wherever Regi was going to take them. With grand gestures, candid expressions, and through the magical voices created for dogs, rabbits, frogs, wicked witches, and beautiful princesses, Regi made the world of her stories real and immediate with characters that howl, kick, and dance and soon so were the children. It seems to me that the children moved in closer and leaned in the longer Regi talked. Her energy and passion were contagious. It was the same when she gave her adult performances, except there were moments when members of the audience were so absorbed in Regi's story that they could not hold back tears. After reading the stories in her book, you, too, will lean in and let her tales carry you off. These are Regi's stories, and with bittersweet humor she connects you to them, to her, and hopefully to others. Regi said once, "I feel kind of like I'm on a mission to show that you don't need anything but yourself, your imagination and your voice to reach people." Sharing her stories so

that others may feel less alone and more connected is her intention. So many people are ostracized, but Regi believes that there is hope for us all. Read her stories; they are riveting.

I found her writing engaging and lyrical, and difficult to put down.

Regina Carpenter brings to life a childhood touched by joy, hard times and suffering, and an indescribable magic. Her tales of growing up in her colorful and chaotic family come off the page and transport you to the family living room where she learns the deadly art of self defense, or the St.
