

When I was 9 in 1956 we lived in a Boston suburb and my Dad took me to Fenway Park for a Red Sox game. This was the infamous game where Ted Williams spit at a fan after being booed when he dropped a fly ball hit by Mickey Mantle. (Unbeknownst to me, obviously, my future wife was also at the game with her grandmother.) From that first game, being a member of the Red Sox nation was a fact of life as I grew up in New England and lived there through my college years. Other than an occasional break to root for the Tampa Bay Rays that my godson was pitching for, I've been a pretty loyal fan over the years despite the ups and downs. So this calls for a split rating decision. If you are a member of the Red Sox nation or just want to understand the craziness of one, the book deserves 5 stars for bringing back lots of great (and some ugly) memories. Since the team is the only one who draws its fan base from 6 states, the title is apt. However, if you are neither a fan or a sports nut, you will probably find this book a crushing bore. If you are a Yankee fan, and therefore a member of the "evil empire" you will certainly hate it. Great literature it isn't. So, say 2.5 stars for this group and nudge it up to four on average.
