

This book just flowed! The writing was excellent, the characters were well developed and engaging. The plot was well thought out. I really liked the way Jennie handles her own investigation and the way the mystery unfolds. I can't wait to read the second book and find out how she handles the issues that are uncovered in her personal life. From what I understand, this book is actually the 4th in the series but is a prequel. I am glad that I read this one first because it really did seem like a

good introduction to the character. I am looking forward to reading the second book (actually first) 'Put Out the Light' and just downloaded it.

The title caught my eye, since I live in KS, but the characters pulled me in. I purchased all her books and read this one last, because it was written last. But it seems the characters were introduced more in this book. All are stand alone books in the series, without feeling like you are rereading the previous book. Loveable, cooky characters whom I adored. Jenny gets you irritated with her antics at times, but that is the charm of her character! You sit back and chuckle or hold your breath, thinking, "Oh, no! Here she goes again!". Loved this new author, and the story behind Ms. Carey Cody becoming an author was interesting. Recommended read for all. Because she is a new author, my small town library didn't have her books. So instead of downloading her series on my Kindle, I purchased them in hardcover and donated them to my library for others to enjoy her books.

Very simple read, but very enjoyable. There were enough twists to leave you wondering. The characters were described and developed, but since the book was a quick-read none of the characters became over-developed. Again, because it was a short-read the characters were able to leave you wondering but the mystery was solved before you are able to have it totally solved for yourself. I enjoyed this and plan to get some more of the "...Oz" series on my Kindle.

I love a book where at one point or another you suspect everyone! This was a really great, fast read where I really did literally suspect every single character at some point or another--except the protagonist. The writing is beautiful and elegant. Although the mystery centers around a murder, there is no graphic violence or graphic descriptions of violence so I think that readers who love a good mystery but don't have the stomach for a lot of gore would really love this. I adored the main character and how she interacts with her children. I just have to read the next one to find out what is in her future!

Usually I can figure out the "who did it" in mysteries within the first 20% of a book. This one took me to 65% to figure out. Great job keeping up the suspense. Good clean book, no detailed gore or gory details. Typically I am not a fan of books written in 3rd person, but use of word imagery helped me to picture being with Jenny instead of just hearing someone tell her story.

This story was pretty good. Engaging and good characters. I never knew "who did it" until the end

and that's a good thing. I'd recommend it.

So this is just the beginning of a terrific series! I've now read four of them and I'm hoping for many more. Ms. Cody develops her characters delightfully and stirs enough complexity into her plots to keep you flipping those pages--even virtually!

A little slow. Not bad, but not an attention grabber either. Ended very abruptly. No bad language. Just a so-so read in my opinion.
