

Awful! I agree with the reviewer who said that this book is written for a ten year old (without the sex, which was poorly written as well: "Aye, more, please.") Written on the level of a Nancy Drew Mystery both in plot and prose, I spent most of the read thinking 'really???' The hero just happens to have a lock pick on him in his jail cell to conveniently get himself out of his manacles? The couple pretends not to be married since her father doesn't want an adopted member of the clan for his daughter? She goes back to being a kitchen wench and he remains with the clan nobility? He cannot bring himself to tell his (albeit adopted) parents he loves them? Can the adoption (vs) birth parent issue be hammered any further into the ground? Stop! Just stop, already!!! Sadly, it never stops. On the 'sap and syrup' front, I was getting cavities. *Ã¢ÂœBella, Bella, what shall I do without you? Ever since that day many moons ago when you kissed me and swore to love me forever, youÃ¢Â™ve had my heart.* *Ã¢Â• Ick.* If this stuff is what you're into, go for it. For me, no thanks.

Loki Grant a very young street urchin abandon by his real parents and left to live in a crate outside a Inn in Ayrs. Loki has been adopted by Brodie and his wife Celestina Grant. Brodie is the brother to the Powerful Laird of Clan Grant. Loki never feels excepted by some of the other lads and lassie of Clan Grant even though his family readily excepts him and treats him love and kindness. One young girl Arabella who live in the Keep kisses him and promises to love him always. As the grow old enough to marry Arabella father will not except him. He doesn't believe that Loki is truly a Grant because he was adopted. Loki feels the only way for Arabella's father to except him is to find out who is natural born parents are. He hopes he is of royal blood or that he can do more exception deeds to garner Arabella fathers acceptance. Loki is a legend in his own time. For the most part I enjoyed the first book in the next generation of the clan Grant/Ramsay books I'm sure we may get into the rest of the clans too but let's start with the Grants. Loki Grant started out

as a street urchin in "Love Letters from Largs" when he was assisting Brodie Grant to track Celestina. They adopt him at the end of the book. As far as the Grants are concerned, he is a Grant, and he and Arabella have been in love since they were 14ish, which is where my first question arises, Bella kissed him and tells him she will love him forever in Jenny Grant's book after Loki saves her, so why is she at the Grant Clan and not the Cameron clan keep? Bella's father won't accept Loki because he is not a Grant by birth or a noble, so he is trying to find out who his birth parents are. This causes problems that I'm not even going to go into because that would be a spoiler alert, they are page turning developments. Next thing that I want to know is, how does she keep sneaking past the guards in the castles that are supposed to be well guarded? Next Torrian is traveling with them and no mention of his special diet is ever made and they seem to be eating things that would make him sick. And She never got the directions from the messenger to find Loki so finding him from where she was would be like finding someone in Portland, Maine after leaving the white mountains of New Hampshire not knowing where you were going, it's just ridiculous. Except for the head shaking, I don't believe it moments, I enjoyed the book, that's why it still got 4 stars

In my opinion there was not much of a story beyond Loki's constant brooding over his origins and inability to marry, interspersed with one or two challenges which were resolved rather quickly. I did not like the characters of Loki nor Arabella and felt they were not well developed, so I could not really connect with them. Loki was supposed to be so smart and yet he constantly acted without thinking when provoked; his love interest Arabella, in my opinion, was headstrong and foolish. Perhaps I had to read the other books to get a better sense of the characters because in this book there was the promise of interesting characters, but it failed to deliver. I kept waiting for the pace to pick up and feel excited about the plot, but that never happened. Even the conclusion of Loki's quest for his parent was a disappointment in that it was uneventful and bland. Overall this was boring to read, no character development and no real story. I am glad I did not waste money on buying this book and I am not inspired to read the others in the

series.

I rarely don't finish a book. This one was a book I couldn't continue reading.
