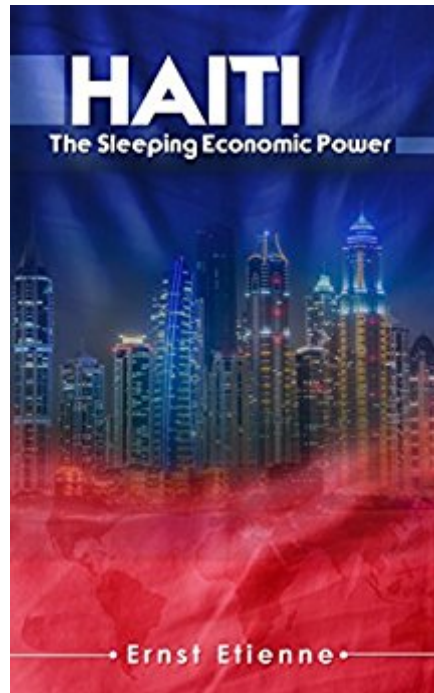




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Haiti: The Sleeping Economic Power

As a Haitian-American, I found this book quite refreshing. Most media outlets only portray Haiti's bleak economic situation while ignoring the natural resources that are abundant on the island and contribute to its natural beauty. "Haiti: The Sleeping Economic Power" talks about the future growth and welfare of Haiti from an isolationist perspective. The author, Ernst Etienne, details how a self-sustained Haiti can improve its own economy without the need for foreign aid. Albeit a little simplistic, the author proposes the country should (1) export more than it imports while encouraging the citizenry to "buy Haitian", (2) create housing with mutable foundations that react favorable to natural disasters, and (3) use clean energy- transform waste to natural energy and use hydroelectricity instead of oil from foreign countries. As someone who hates math, the book's formulaic layout can be intimidating but Etienne simply uses this as another way to illustrate how Haiti can use its existing assets to transform from a developing country to an economic super-power. Even though the book does not go in depth about Haiti's history, culture and government, the book is a political commentary. Therefore, I highly recommend this book to anyone with an interest in politics, economics, and/or humanitarianism.

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
