

Whether you are writing books or articles for publication, Kathy Ide's book is a must-have. She has compiled the most-often used rules from the publishing industry standards (Chicago Manual of Style [for books], Associated Press Stylebook [for newspapers and some magazines], and the Christian Writers Manual of Style) into a convenient resource book that should be on every writers bookshelf. Ide not only covers punctuation, usage, grammar, and spelling (which she calls the PUGS), but also shows you how to proofread for typos, inaccuracies, and inconsistencies. Included are quotes from well-published authors that reveal some of their personal hints for self-editing. I've recommended Kathy Ide's previous book to many writers--and I will be doing the same with this new, expanded, exciting book, Proofreading Secrets of Best-Selling Authors.

Proofreading Secrets of Best-Selling Authors is a "must have" for anyone who works with words. Whether you're an editor, beta reader, aspiring writer, business professional, college student, or blogger, there's something in this book that will help you. As an editor, I have a shelf full of style guides and dictionaries. The average person may have a style guide from their college days, and a dictionary or two. I'll be the first to admit, not only is it expensive to buy multiple reference works for the various genres I encounter, it can be downright frustrating to search through them. Proofreading Secrets of Best-Selling Authors cuts through the over 1,000 intimidating pages of the Chicago Manual of Style, The Christian Writer's Manual of Style, and the Associated Press Stylebook, to provide writers with solutions to their most common issues, using everyday writing. You don't need to be an academic to understand and apply her principles. If you can read this review, you can follow her advice. You don't need a deep wallet to afford multiple reference books; less than \$10 buys something you'll use time and again. The book is well-organized, with the writer in mind. Kathy doesn't just tell you the correct way to do something, she shows you with examples for each topic.

For every rule that Kathy Ide describes, she references the corresponding location in the above-mentioned style guides. If there's a difference between how the style guides handle a situation, Kathy points that out in her book. The chapters contain sections to add your own notes as well. On a personal note, I recently refused editing work from several potential clients. Each had recently self-published a book on , and were horrified at negative reviews due to poor grammar, spelling errors, typographical errors, etc. Unfortunately, they hadn't budgeted for editing, and couldn't afford the extensive services required to bring the manuscripts up to the standards their readers expect. If the writers had followed the guidance in this book, my fee would have been approximately 50% less than I originally quoted. I highly recommend buying and using Kathy Ide's *Proofreading Secrets of Best-Selling Authors*. Your editor will love you for this. Your readers deserve it.

In seconds, just thumbing through this work I finally found out how to use correct punctuation with quotation marks. A totally essential reference work that makes it easy for a grammatically incapacitated writer, like myself to become savvy in the craft.

You don't have to be writing a novel to benefit from this book. Kathy Ide has assembled an excellent standalone reference that will enable you to improve your writing. It doesn't matter if you create memos, letters, or novels. I have added this book to my collection of references that I keep on my desk. Buy and keep it handy.
