

Written by the late L'Engle (*A Wrinkle in Time*) in the 1940s and never before published, this romantic coming-of-age story will immediately draw in listeners. Twenty-year-old Liz Gerard has wanted to be an actress for as long as she can remember, and has finally been allowed to test her talents by apprenticing at a summer stock company. There Liz falls for the slightly older, charming director, Kurt. During a pivotal weekend, however, Liz learns that Kurt's intentions are not so honorable and she comes to appreciate Ben, who has been patiently waiting in the wings. Listening to Reed's narration of this dialogue-rich work is akin to attending a play. Her expert use of pauses, shifts in voices and quiet passion bring this story to life. Teens may need explanations of items like dirndl skirts and telephones with no dialing mechanisms, but the basic story of first love and deception transcends the period setting. Grade 8 Up • During her apprenticeship at a summer theater company, 20-year-old Elizabeth begins to discover what acting and actors are all about and she falls in love for the first time in this story (Farrar, 2008) written in the 1940's and based on Madeleine L'Engle's experiences working for a theater company in Nantucket for two summers. Weekly guest stars, regular cast members, and fellow students help Elizabeth realize what achieving her dream will entail. The introduction and a bonus interview are by the author's granddaughter, Lena Roy, who recalls how this story was written for her and her sisters. Narrator Maggi-Meg Reed provides subtle voice changes for the different characters, making it difficult at the beginning to determine who is speaking. very flowery dramatic language and characters - understand it is set in a theatre troupe environment, so the writing style may be deliberate. But it was harder to get through than L'Engle's other books.

The story takes place in 1946, over 4 days in the life of Elizabeth Jerrold while she is working summer stock. Elizabeth is a recent college graduate who knows she wants to devote her life to the theater. She loves the theater and the people she has met there, especially Kurt Canitz, an older director. Life seems perfect and the summer unending. Then Aunt Harriet calls and states that she will not pay Elizabeth's tuition to stay at the summer stock anymore. Elizabeth must scramble to find a way to squeak out one more week of summer stock so she can see her favorite actress, Valborg Andersen, perform. And what about Kurt? M's L'Engle's story is dated, as some of the other critics have said. But it's still well written and a good read. It was fun to learn about what goes on in summer stock - the various classes, the practices and the people. I really enjoyed this book even though it's not of the same caliber as the "Wrinkle in Time" quartet. I recommend this book highly for all who are interested in seeing how summer stock works as well as those who want a good read.
