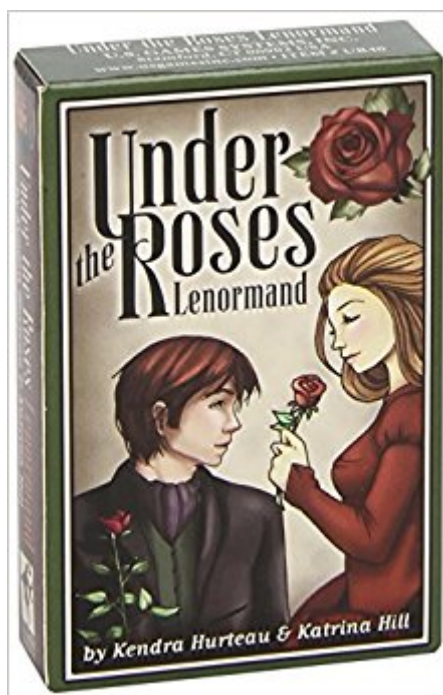

This deck is really beautiful. I especially love the backs. The overall color and mood is delicious, and these cards are a pleasure to read. The images are clear and straightforward, which is important for quick assessments during Grand Tableau readings. For a bonus, you get an extra lady, gentleman and child. Most decks focus on caucasians for these cards given their roots. This deck thoughtfully provides caucasians as well as African Americans, making this deck more resonant for African American sitters. Also, having the extra lady/gent card means you can read for same-sex relationships should the querent request that. The only annoyances I have are the deviations from the traditional cards. Unlike Tarot, Lenormand cards have fixed images and names, and changing the symbol or name changes the card. Examples: the locket, which is a heart locket and stands for

the heart card; the snake, which keeps its name, focuses on a pirate type of woman with a snake perched on her shoulder, narrowing or distracting from the meaning; the grave is usually the coffin; the book has become the journal, again shifting the meaning; and the whip has a dominatrix type of woman in a provocative outfit holding a whip, constraining the meaning. The scythe has been renamed the sickle and is fine but could throw a newbie off. More traditionally, the birds is called the owls, and there are two. This is a lovely touch. Keywords are also on the cards but screened back so lightly they are difficult to read, which I like because it doesn't detract from the images. The LWB does include keywords. It's a wonderful deck!

There are other more descriptive and informative reviews, but I just wanted to share that this is the only Lenormande style deck that has ever worked for me. I have read tarot privately for over 20 years and professionally for 10 and would occasionally look at the Lenormande and Oracle cards-- and had 0 connection with them. Maybe offering the beautiful signifier cards in a multicultural way opened a door for me, or made me more open to these cards, but suddenly I found myself being able to read and understand what the Lenormande was saying-- and I did accuracy tests to confirm. I am stunned and delighted to have a new way to divine. And I know that for some of the people I work with being able to see a signifier that looks like them (in such a lovely Victorian classic style) will really appeal to them and help them engage with cards to work with them, and helping the querent feel connected to spirit and empowered...well that's the point, isn't it?

These are beautiful cards and I am very pleased with the deck. I have been using the tarot for many years and this is my lenormand deck. One of the reviews stated that the descriptions of the cards are written very lightly on the cards, which is true. However, the words are way too light for me read, even with my glasses on. So If you are looking for a deck with the descriptions written on them, you might want to select a different deck. There are duplicate cards for the child, gentleman, and lady, expressing racial diversity, which I really like. I have scanned and uploaded images of them.

Under the Roses is my first Lenormand deck. The images on the cards are gorgeous. That's what drew me to the cards in the first place, the images. I'm totally new to Lenormand, so I'm not knowledgeable about the cards. I read a review that said these cards deviate from a traditional Lenormand deck. Keep that in mind if you've used other traditional Lenormand decks. The cards are sturdy, well-made and easy to shuffle. The smaller size is a nice change from larger tarot and oracle cards. You will really like these if you have small hands. There are also two versions of the child, the

lady and the gentleman - which I think is a nice touch. You choose the version of the card that best suits the situation or the person for which you're reading. In all, this is a nice deck of cards.

These cards are eerily accurate, and the symbolism of each image is so obvious that they are very easy to read in a variety of ways. I can't speak highly enough of them. I love, love, LOOOVE these. So much.

I love it so much I purchased a 2nd so that I will have one when, not if but when, I wear the first one out. this deck is that good. divination decks or any kind are very personal. what speaks to me may not speak to you. this deck resonates deeply. I've only had it a short time but it is already a favorite go-to deck.

I ordered this because I thought that I would be able to see the key words written on the cards as advertised, they are there but you would need bionic sight to see them. I even asked my teens if they could read the print and they could only faintly make out one or two and that was with twisting the cards in all kinds of directions to catch the light a certain way. On the plus side I like the extra Lady and Gent and child cards.

The deck is not only the right size but the images are of high quality ... and even its scent is pleasant. The symbolism is clear and true to the classic representations of Lenormand. And fall into romanticism as other "floral" decks
