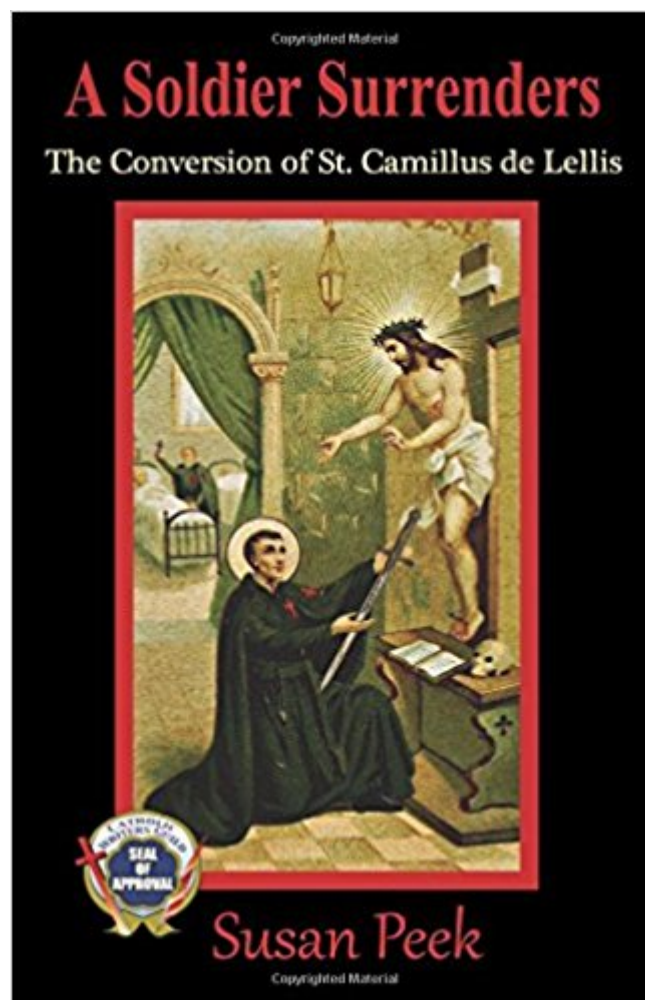

I have been reading quite a few books about the crusades and fell in love with El Cid by Fitzhenry. Started this book right after El Cid because the reviews say it's a wonderful story for youth and adults. While the story is certainly inspiring, the writing style is very juvenile. I thought at first it may just be because I had just experienced the exceptional writing of Fitzhenry, but even after giving it some time, it was very difficult to read this book with respect. The author no doubt has wonderful intentions, however, in perhaps the attempt to appeal to a younger audience by making the story more along their vocabulary base, it really distracted from the beauty of this man's life and struggles and journey to surrender. I was waiting for the word 'dude' to appear, that's how casual the language in this book is. I was hoping to have my 15 and 13 year old sons read this but I'm afraid they will be put off by the 'cheasiness' of the text. It's something I would recommend for an 8-11 year old only. As an adult, it was an extremely simple read and the overall story is good but be aware that this is a rather juvenile writing despite the gorgeous artwork on the cover.
