

We are in our third decade of exploring and mapping Costa Rica and delighted to Jack's insightful tales uncovering the idiosyncrasies that are so familiar to anyone who has spent time there. These stories also revealed surprising discoveries on nearly every page and after reading them we felt we knew the people, history and culture in a unique new way. The book unwinds Costa Rica's lifeline -- starting millions of years ago with geology, and paleoecology, moving ahead with historical fiction vignettes based on archaeological and anthropological evidence of the first indigenous peoples, presenting the last century through narratives gleaned from conversations with early settlers and their descendants and completing the story with his experience as a driving force in the country's evolution from an economy based on clear cutting forests for ranching and farming to a world leader in ecological awareness and conservation. The cattle business may have brought Jack Ewing to Costa Rica, but his love of nature kept him there. In 1970 Jack and his wife and young daughter ventured to Costa Rica for a 4-month job. They never left. Although life in the jungle with few modern conveniences was a far cry from his native Colorado roots, his ever-growing fascination with the rainforest soon prompted his transformation into environmentalist and naturalist. Hacienda Barú National Wildlife Refuge - a former cattle ranch and now a well-known ecotourism destination on the southwest coast of Costa

Rica - was the result of Jack's decades of dedication to forest ecology. His expertise on biological corridor projects is much sought after, and he is currently president of two environmental organizations, ASANA (Association of Friends of Nature) and FUNDANTA (Foundation for the Path of the Tapir Biological Corridor). A natural-born storyteller, Jack's articles have appeared regularly in Costa Rican publications, and he often speaks to environmental, student and ecological traveler groups. His years of living in the rainforest have rendered a multitude of personal experiences, many of which are recounted in his first book, *Monkeys Are Made of Chocolate*.

Just finished reading this amazing book by Jack Ewing. I laughed, I cried, I learned, I wanted to return to Hacienda Baru where I had visited in 2015. What a journey Jack and his wife and children have taken in Costa Rica. How they have evolved from ranching to eco-tourism and preserving the bio-diversity of their little corner of the world is a remarkable story. Jack's tales are outstanding, but one of my favorite quotes is from his son Chris who said "My greatest take-away from being raised in rural Costa Rica is the ability to find the positive when events do not unfold according to plan, an attitude embraced by few Americans when their plans unravel." Like his earlier "Monkeys are Made of Chocolate", Ewing describes nature in Costa Rica, its turbulent history, and the ongoing efforts to preserve and, where possible, restore it. Political and economic realities are addressed. This is a MUST-OWN reference for anyone working in conservation and sustainable economies today.
